The position will suit self-motivated people who want to broaden their experience in a school setting alongside their tertiary study. Successful applicants will work in a collaborative environment and should be willing to contribute to all facets of school life, and have a desire to share their Christian faith.

Personal Attributes

Applicants should demonstrate a clear understanding of, and affinity with, the ethos and philosophy of ASC and:

- be active in their Christian faith
- have intellectual strength, professional integrity and a passion for education
- be enthusiastic about their chosen vocation
- have a commitment to pastoral care and a knowledge of the social and emotional issues which affect young people
- demonstrate ongoing enthusiasm, initiative and innovation
- be able to communicate effectively
- show a commitment to their own ongoing professional learning
- demonstrate approachability and flexibility

Requirements/ Qualifications

- Have commenced studying or be enrolled to study Education at a tertiary level
- Be actively involved in a bible-based, Christian church
- NSW Working with Children Check Clearance
- First Aid (training can be organised with the school)

The Program

Interns will engage in a diverse range of school-based functions, not ordinarily covered as part of university study or practicum experiences, providing experience and insight into the diversity of an Anglican school setting.

Essential Responsibilities

Successful applicants will readily:

- engage in the school's professional learning program, including professional development days (where study permits), staff meetings and Professional Learning Groups
- participate in faculty planning and programming, including attending faculty meetings
- participate in the pastoral program of the school, including being actively engaged in the Tutor/ Homeroom/ House/ Year Group programs
- participate in the co-curricular program
- participate in the camp program (where study permits)
- engage in duties and supervision where required
- contribute to supporting the learning of students
- support students requiring special provisions for assessment
- · seek opportunities to learn and grow from their mentor and colleagues



Other experiences may include:

- be guided on planning, teaching, marking and giving feedback
- learning how to write reports
- learning how to conduct parent teacher interviews
- learning how to establish effective partnerships with parents to support student learning and wellbeing
- learning how to create a positive learning environment in the classroom, implement effective classroom management skills
- learning how to manage a classroom effectively and promote positive student engagement
- learning how to present authentically a Christian worldview
- the role of restorative practice in Christian education
- learning how to differentiate teaching programs
- learning how a pedagogical framework operates
- learning strategies to meet the learning needs of students
- integrating technology in the delivery of teaching programs
- learning formative and summative assessment strategies
- understanding school policy and procedure

Additional Learning and Engagement

Interns will engage in additional learning opportunities focused on teaching from a Christian worldview. This study will be presented in modules and will be spread out across the tenure of the internship.

Interns will also attend an event each term hosted by ASC, where they will have the opportunity to connect with other interns and other school personnel, as well as engage in a workshop or hear from a speaker.

Interns will be guided in developing their curriculum vitae and job application and coached with interview practice.

Practicum Placements

Where required, interns will be supported in securing a practicum placement in another ASC school.

Commitment

- Interns must attend the school as per the negotiated arrangements
- Interns must engage wholeheartedly in the life of the school
- Interns must address any concerns raised by the school-based supervisor
- Interns must maintain a minimum credit average for their university study
- Interns must attend ASC-hosted events, generally once each term
- Interns must complete the modules exploring teaching from a Christian worldview



Benefits

- Interns will be provided with a strong experience in an educational setting and will gain valuable insight into the full scope of a teacher's role in an Anglican school
- Interns will be fostered during their study period and will be provided with a solid steppingstone into their career
- Interns will be paid a salary consistent with the Independent Schools NSW (Support and Operational Staff) Multi-Enterprise Agreement
- Contribution towards their HECS fees
- Interns will be provided with a laptop computer for the duration of their tenure
- At the conclusion of their tertiary study, and subject to satisfactory participation in the ASC internship, Interns will be offered a teaching position in an ASC school, which they will be expected to hold for a period of no less than three years

Should the Intern decline the position in an ASC school offered to them at the conclusion of their study, they will be required to repay any university fees covered, the cost of the fees to complete the modules, the cost of their participation in hosted events and any costs of the laptop lease provided for the duration of their tenure as an Intern.

Applications

Please send a covering letter identifying interest in the program together with your curriculum vitae and the names of three referees. At least one referee should be your current minister or someone from your church who can attest to your Christian faith and practice.

Applicants should demonstrate commitment to co-curricular pursuits and community service as well as outlining previous employment experience and study.
