The successful applicant will be willing to contribute to the co-curricular and pastoral life of the School and will be active in their own Christian faith and involved in their church.

ROLE SUMMARY

As a teacher, you will be responsible for creating a teaching and learning environment where students are at the heart of the classroom and emphasis is placed a love of God, a love of life, a love of learning and a love for others.

You will be expected to design and implement quality learning experiences, which address NESA curriculum requirements and individual student needs. MPAC Teachers will empower students as active agents in their own learning and include the student's world (family and community) in their educational journey, ensuring an holistic approach to excellence in education and develop lives of rich character.

THE CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate for this position will be a suitably qualified person, who has a love of young people and is keen to be an active part of the growth and development of Marsden Park Anglican College. They will have a passion for their craft and a desire to be part of a professional learning community. They will present a professional image, demonstrate an active Christian faith and be involved in their local church.

REQUIREMENTS

- A degree in Education from an approved and recognised tertiary institution
- Accreditation with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)
- Current Working with Children Check Number for paid work

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Demonstrate ongoing practice that meets the Australian Professional Standards of Teachers.
- Demonstrate a thorough understanding of the NESA Stage 4 to 6 syllabus documents for your subject area and teaching timetabled classes as required.
- Develop, implement, and evaluate teaching and learning programs that incorporate differentiated strategies to meet the specific learning needs of students across a range of abilities, including the development of literacy and numeracy skills.
- Adhere to all curriculum expectations and deadlines as set out by NESA and the College.
- Incorporate the language and habits associated with a learning culture within regular classroom practice, establishing high expectations and empowering students to develop as powerful learners.
- Create and maintain a positive and engaging learning space for the students.
- Establish and maintain effective classroom management and discipline practices to ensure students are safe and supported as they learn.



- Incorporate strategies to promote the safe, responsible, and ethical use of ICT.
- Ensure meaningful and effective assessment practices to inform programming, teaching, and reporting.
- Provide regular and timely feedback to students and their families regarding progress, achievements, behaviour, and application using accurate and reliable records.
- Critically engage in professional learning to update knowledge and practice.
- Support and promote the College's pastoral care and wellbeing programs, diverse co-curricular programs and extra-curricular events including but not limited to involvement in carnivals, camps, excursions, co-curricular activities and events.
- Attend meetings, parent-teacher interviews, events and playground duties as required.
- Implement relevant programs, policy, and legislative requirements, including the Code of Conduct, to ensure student well-being and safety.
- Undertake any other duties as directed by Principal, or his delegate.

It should be noted that, while detailed, this role description is not exhaustive and the Principal may, at their discretion, vary these responsibilities as required by the learning, wellbeing, cultural, community and administrative requirements of the College.
